Keisha's Story



Keisha was living with her Dad during her early teens, but the living situation was crowded. She had to share a room and never had any time to herself, which caused problems.

After many arguments, Keisha was kicked out. She stayed at a friend's house for a week, before coming to our Homeless Prevention Service. Keisha received advice about what she could do next and moved to the Roundabout Hostel, where she began her journey to independence.

She attends college and volunteers in her spare time as a Peer Educator in schools. Roundabout's Peer Education programme not only aims to prevent young people from becoming homeless in the future, but it helps to build up the confidence and skills of our volunteers. Keisha has flourished in the role and has since received an award from BBC Radio Sheffield, been filmed by the National Lottery and spoken at Roundabout fundraising events.

"I've gone into loads of schools and talked about homelessness to raise awareness which has really built up my confidence. Right now I'm studying for my A Levels at college. In the future I want to be a midwife, so I plan to go to University and get a degree in Nursing and Midwifery."

Our Guide to Fundraising Online

Decided what challenge you would like to do but unsure of where to start your fundraising? We have got you covered!

Setting up an online fundraising page is a great way to collect online sponsorship without feeling too pushy. We recommend using Just Giving, Virgin Money Giving or Facebook Fundraising. These sites will allow your fundraising to be safe and secure and they are really easy to share on social media and by email!

Personalise your page with your story, photos and training updates. This means that you can share your page more often with your progress!

Share Share with your friends, family and colleagues. Whether this is on social media, text, Whatsapp, Messenger or in person. JustGiving say that 20% of donations come in after an event, so keep sharing!

Top Tip: Social media is a great way to ask for sponsorship as you never know who's scrolling and could be motivated by the cause! Photos, boomerangs and videos are really engaging. Posting at popular times of the day like late afternoon is effective too.

1 Plan Ahead

Keep it simple, make a checklist and start planning early on.

2. Set A Target

Setting a fundraising goal can help motivate fundraisers but make sure it is right for you!

3. Create A Budget

If you know your event will have some costs, it is worth doing a quick budget to make sure you are making a profit.

4 Register Your Event

Before you start advertising your event email fundraising@roundaboutltd.org or fill out an online fundraising form to let us know about your event. We can then send you some fundraising materials, including bunting, balloons, t-shirts, games, leaflets and a letter of authority, which is essential when asking for raffle prizes.

5. Event Checklist

Make sure you consider the location, date and times, theme, price and ticketing. These are the simple things that can make your event a success. Don't forget to use your contacts to sell tickets or get lots of prizes! You can also tag us on social media and we can share your messages. We can also supply you with our In Support Of logo to use for your event.

6. After Your Event

Let us know how your event went and send us some of your photos - we would love to share what you have been doing on our social media! We can also let you know at this point how best to get the money you raised to us. Once we have received the funds, we can send a big THANK YOU!



Reaching your goal

Taking on a challenge for charity is a rewarding experience but trying to hit the fundraising goal can be quite daunting. Don't panic, the Roundabout Fundraising Team are here to help!

We have put together a few of our best ideas to help you reach your minimum fundraising target. No matter your target, we can provide you with a guide that's full of fundraising activities to help breakdown the overall target, making it more manageable for you! Here's an example of what you can find in the guide:

You can hit your fundraising target by fundraising in different ways. Every penny raised will help you reach your goal!

Example target: £500



Sell unwanted items at a boot sale or online

Raised: £100



Host a coffee morning and invite friends over for some yummy cake

Raised: £150



Hold a car wash with a group of willing volunteers and lots of sponges

Raised: £250

Other ways to support Roundabout

Raise and Give

Join your University fundraising team and get involved with their incredible challenges, from there you can nominate Roundabout as the charity of the year!

Fundraising at School

Do you have a charity committee or School Council that would want to get involved? Why not suggest a fundraiser in aid of Roundabout? Non-uniform days are always popular!

Collection Tins

Are you a local business that could host a collection tin for us? Let us know!

Donations in Kind

Did you know that we collect donations of items too? From hygiene products to colouring books, we collect items to help our young people. We also accept donations for raffles and other prizes! Please ask us what we currently need before starting your collection.

Gift Aid It

If a donation is made by a UK tax payer, we can claim another 25p per £1 donated if they check the box. This can be a really effective way to boost your funds and it doesn't cost anything!

Match Giving

Ask your company if they offer match giving - this is where they donate to top up your fundraising.

Paying in your fundraising

Thank you so much for fundraising for Roundabout!

Your donations mean we can give vulnerable young people a brighter future and help end youth homelessness, so a HUGE thank you for your support.

The next step is to pay in your fundraising!





Boost your donation with Gift Aid

If you are a UK taxpayer, you can make your donation go further by clicking the Gift Aid box when donating online or by completing a form (let us know if you need one). It doesn't cost you a penny more and we can claim an extra 25p for every £1 you donate! If you have fundraised with a paper sponsorship form, then don't forget to send it in to us so we can claim the Gift Aid.



DONATE ONLINE

Make a payment online through the 'Donate' button on our website (roundabouthomeless.org). Donations can also be made via JustGiving and Virgin Money Giving, but please note that donations made this way may incur fees and administration costs.



BY POST

You can send us your donations in the form of a cheque made payable to 'Roundabout Ltd' and post it to our office (Roundabout Fundraising, The Circle, 33 Rockingham Lane, Sheffield, S1 4FW). Don't forget to let us know who you are so we can say thank you!



IN PERSON

Call us on 0114 253 6753 to organise a time to pop into our office at The Circle, 33 Rockingham Lane, Sheffield, S1 4FW on any weekday from 9am – 4pm to pay in your donation.



BY BANK TRANSFER

Donations can also be made to us directly through a BACS payment. Please email our fundraising team at fundraising@roundaboutltd.org or call on 0114 253 6753 for our bank details.

The Important Bits

Raffle, Lotteries and Tombolas

There are lots of rules and regulations in place in regards to these types of fundraising, so make sure you know if you need a license. The best place to find this information is with your local Council's licensing team.

Event Raffle

If you are holding a raffle on private property (such as at work or a club) you need to make sure that it is clear who is organising the raffle and that tickets are only sold on the premises. Small lotteries, including raffles as a part of a bigger event such as a fair, can be held without a license. The tickets must be sold and drawn on the same day as the event and tickets cannot be sold over multiple days or at varied locations. Any money spent on acquiring prizes must not exceed £250 per raffle, however there is no monetary limit for donated goods.

Multi-Day Raffle

If you are selling tickets in advance of drawing the raffle to the general public, then you must register the event with your local authority and check if you need a license. You will also need to get your raffle tickets printed that have your promoter number on as well as the details of the charity and the fundraising event.

Licenses, such as bucket collection licenses are free or you may not need one, but it is very important to check.

Health and Safety

If you are running your own event, make sure you have a qualified **First Aider** present and that you have completed a risk assessment. You may also need adequate insurance cover.

Collecting Money

To collect on public land such as a street, you must always ask permission from the local authority and obtain the correct license. If you are collecting money on private land, such as a supermarket, you must have written permission from the manager or land owner. If you are collecting money for Roundabout, please let us know so we can supply you with a collection tin or bucket and a letter of authority.

Food and Drink

If you are providing food and drink at an event, you may be required to have a Food Hygiene Certificate, especially if you are selling food to the general public.

For any advice with this matter, please contact your local authority through the environmental health department.

Risk Assessment

If you're holding an event that other people will attend, it's up to you to make sure that it's safe for everyone. Please make sure you do a risk assessment which will help you to think about the potential risks and how you can minimise these for everyone. Better safe than sorry!
